



EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Merit Badge Requirements

- 1) Earn the First Aid merit badge.
- 2) Do the following:
 - A) Tell what you would do to prevent injury and possible loss of life to yourself and others in each of the following emergencies: fire or explosion at home and in a public building, car stalled in blizzard or desert, motor vehicle accident, mountain accident, food poisoning, boating accident, search for lost person, lost or marooned group, gas leak, earthquake, flood, tornado or hurricane, atomic emergency, and avalanche (snow or rock).
 - B) Show that you know what to do in at least TWO of the above.
- 3) Show how you could safely save a person from the following:
 - A) Touching a live electric wire.
 - B) A room with carbon monoxide or other fumes or smoke.
 - C) Clothes on fire.
 - D) Drowning using non-swimming rescues (including ice accidents).
- 4) Tell the things a group of Scouts should be prepared to do, the training needed, and the safety precautions to be taken for the following emergency service:
 - A) Crowd or traffic control.
 - B) Messenger service and communication.
 - C) Collection and distribution services.
 - D) Group feeding, shelter, and sanitation.
- 5) Take part in an emergency service project, either real or a practice drill.
- 6) Show three ways of attracting and communicating with rescue planes.
- 7) With another person, show a good way to move an injured person out of a remote and rugged area, conserving the energy of the rescuers.
- 8) Do the following:



