



Junior Leader Job Description for Chaplain Aide

INTRODUCTION: When you accepted the position of Chaplain Aide, you agreed to provide service and leadership in our troop. This responsibility should be fun and rewarding. This job description provides some of the things you are expected to do while serving as a junior leader.

RESPONSIBLE TO: Senior Patrol Leader (SPL), Scoutmaster, Troop Chaplain

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

- Assist in Troop planning to consider religious holidays and include religious observances in activities.
 - Works with his Pastor, Youth Minister or Troop Chaplain in preparing and conducting religious services at Troop activities.
 - Informs Scouts of religious emblem program of their faith and encourages them to earn the emblem.
 - Sets the example and encourages Troop members to live up to the ideals of the Scout Oath, Law and Slogan.
 - Wear the uniform correctly.
 - Live by the Scout Oath and Law.
